What is Brainzooming? Quickly Addressing Things that Matter with Insight & Innovation.

Facilitator Role

- Facilitate a small team through multiple pre-designed Brainzooming group exercises.
- Encourage the group to explore potential ideas about St. Ann living out its mission in more impactful ways.
- Help document ideas the group shares during the Brainzooming exercises.
- Manage activities and timing to ensure the team is progressing in identifying ideas and moving through activities.

Brainzooming Ground Rules

- Encourage freely sharing ideas.
- Say what comes to mind don't self-censor or censor others. Emphasize quantity.
- Use fast, furious, & short brainstorming spurts. We'll invest time looking at opportunities from multiple perspectives in short time periods versus one long exercise from a single view.
- Set an aggressive goal for the number of ideas and share it with participants.
- Say all ideas aloud. Write them all down on sticky notes with markers; this makes it easier to select, combine, & prioritize ideas.
- If someone has a "why something won't work" comment, they need a "how it CAN work" comment.

5 Keys for Facilitators within the Brainzooming Methodology

1. The facilitator is present to serve the group, its strengths, and weaknesses.

Far better to reach the desired result and be forgotten as a facilitator than to be remembered for being part of the reason a group wasn't successful.

2. Provide energy and cheerleading for the group.

Our format is heavily question-based. Keep coming back to the questions underlying each exercise, bringing excitement and encouragement to group members' participation.

3. One of the facilitator's chief roles is managing and respecting participant time.

By sticking as best possible to the timing guidelines and keeping the session moving, you help create energy, focus, and productivity within the group.

4. Draw out new creative thinking from the participants.

Actively push, prod, stimulate, and cajole the group for more ideas throughout the time they are working together.

5. A facilitator is more important for creating "white space" than for sharing ideas.

Depending on how the group is progressing toward answers, cheer a lot, suggest a little, and say what YOU think the answer is only as a LAST resort. Try to answer their questions with questions. The group will get to where it needs to be as you give them sufficient encouragement and room to explore.

We'll have people take breaks as they need them throughout the morning.

Exercise 1A: What will success look like? (Simultaneous Activity on Success)

Overview: This exercise is designed to allow the participants to share their perspectives about what will define success from activities focused on this part of the strategy. Across the four prompts, participants will consider differing views of success from both inside and outside the organization.

Timing and Desired Output:

We expect to spend up to five minutes on each of the four perspectives:

- For the parish as a whole This perspective relates to the varied ways the church/parish would gauge success from an organizational viewpoint, including membership, number of active participants, giving, vibrancy of programs and ministries, etc.
- For those who regularly participate – This perspective on success accounts for anyone who regularly participates in the parish's liturgies, activities, ministries, and

groups, including anyone with children in the school or school of religion. While this will generally include registered members, it can include others who are present in the parish, including members of other parishes, instructors, etc.

- For those who aren't regularly participating This includes anyone (registered parishioners or others) who are part of any part of St. Ann throughout the year, but may not consider themselves as engaged and affiliated with the parish. This could also include people who were formerly active, but now have narrowed their participation to certain liturgies or activities.
- For the broader community in which St. Ann Lives This can include multiple "communities" where St. Ann resides: the archdiocese, Johnson County, Prairie Village. It's vital to consider within this perspective how our non-Catholic neighbors might experience St. Ann even though they have never walked into any of the parish facilities or liturgies before.

Facilitator Role: You'll help capture answers and remind the participants to think about the varied perspectives within each prompt. Invite them to step outside of their own perspectives to think with the eyes of audiences who feel more, less, or differently connected to St. Ann. Since this will be the first exercise, you may need to remind people that they don't need to justify ANY of their answers. It's fine that they say and write them down so that they're visible on the poster.

Participant Role: Participants, as they move through the varied perspectives, will need to display empathy for how other audiences might see success. One of the easiest ways to do this is to imagine others that they know who have the other perspectives. For the "parish as a whole" perspective, this can include how they'd view things as a staff member or organizational leader. Throughout, they don't need to produce number-based objectives, although those are welcome, too.

Exercise 1B: Success and Challenges (Simultaneous Activity on Success)

Overview: This companion success-focused exercise can take place simultaneously with the What Will Success Look Like exercise. It is designed to help participants imagine important factors that will pave the way for success or could stand in the way of accomplishing the intended outcomes. It does this by asking participants to look back from three years from now based on whether the plan is successful or falls short. We find it much easier for participants to look backward from the future than to look forward from today and imagine important factors.



Timing and Desired Output: Based on the poster, it appears that there is a lot going on here. The seven prompts on each side of the poster are simply presented to help people think about multiple dimensions of success. They are there for the facilitator as talking points rather than needing to create specific suggestions for each one. Within 20 minutes, we'd hope to spend 10 minutes on each side (Success, Falling Short) of the poster. We're looking for 15-20 suggested factors for each one.

Facilitator Role: You'll focus the participants on each side of the poster for approximately 10 minutes each. During that time, you can remind everyone that they are looking backward from the future. If they are stuck at any point, use the 7 prompts (things we did, others did, we didn't do, others didn't do, external or internal developments, other areas) to suggest new ways to imagine what enabled success or led to falling short. Help them to get beyond the natural tendency to simply say the opposite of the success factors on the barriers side of the poster.


Participant Role: The primary task for participants is to freely think backward from the future. While it seems a small thing versus thinking from now into the future, we definitely find that doing this leads to more robust thinking.

Exercise 2A & 2B: Ideas Posters (Two Different Posters – Simultaneous Activity)

Overview: This is an ideation activity to address the opportunity from multiple, varied perspectives. With the opportunity in the center of the poster, start at the question about INITIAL IDEAS, moving through question on the outside to explore potential new ideas and experiences. In 25 or 30 minutes, the entire small group can work with the facilitator to generate a variety of possible ideas.

Timing & Desired Output:

After setting the stage with the opportunity, spend 3-5 minutes at each question.

Continue to ask how the specific question addresses the opportunity. This should provide at least 40 and up to 60 ideas across the entire exercise.

Ideally, we'll have the group split into two smaller groups, each working on one of the two idea

posters you have available.

Facilitator Role: Facilitators are cheerleaders and questioners during this exercise. You'll encourage the group's effort to identify new ways to address each opportunity using all the question prompts. You'll need to encourage people who may not be participating to share ideas. If a group seems reluctant to tackle any question, challenge them to think more openly and to imagine things that may not be in place today.






Exercise 3: Recommending Ideas Based on Implementation Ease and Change

Overview: This final exercise is an opportunity for everyone to move ideas that they feel strongly about to this poster for consideration as part of the strategy.

They will be placing ideas they select on two dimensions:

- How Easy to Implement: Simple to Complex
- How Different: Enhancing Today or Introducing New Activities



Before the exercise, we'll provide a maximum number of ideas anyone can move over (likely 3 ideas). They don't have to make the case for moving or placing them on the grid. To the extent there is time, we'll have the team discuss the placement of ideas and potentially move them within the poster.

Timing & Desired Output: The time for this activity will depend on how much time we have available in the event. We typically allot 8 minutes to move ideas and then up to 20 or 30 minutes to discuss placement, generally focusing on checking whether Simple ideas are properly placed.

Facilitator Role: Remind people of how many ideas they can move to the grid, followed by facilitating a brief conversation on whether the group thinks that individually-placed ideas are appropriately positioned.

Participant Role: Making relatively quick assessments of what ideas they'd like to advance to this poster, and then being open to efficiently discussing the placement.
